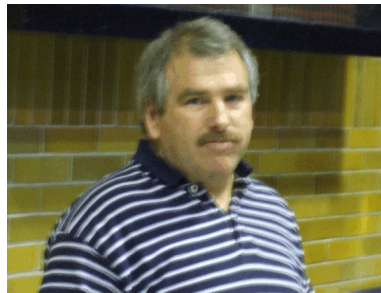

4) Sunday March 14, 2010

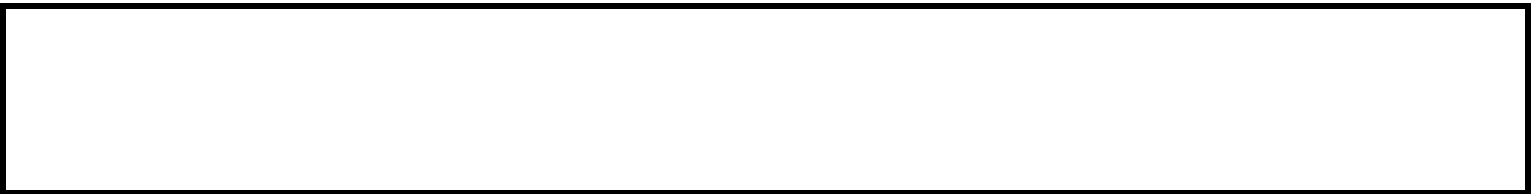
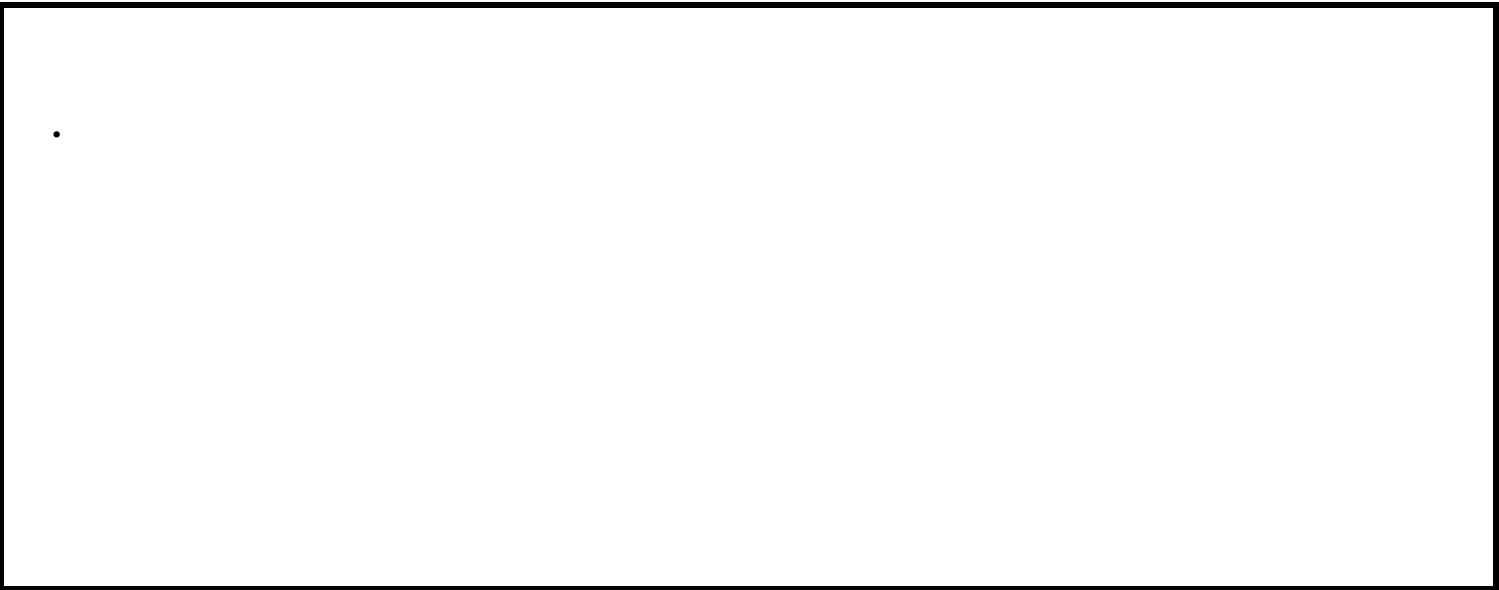
5) Sunday April 18, 2010

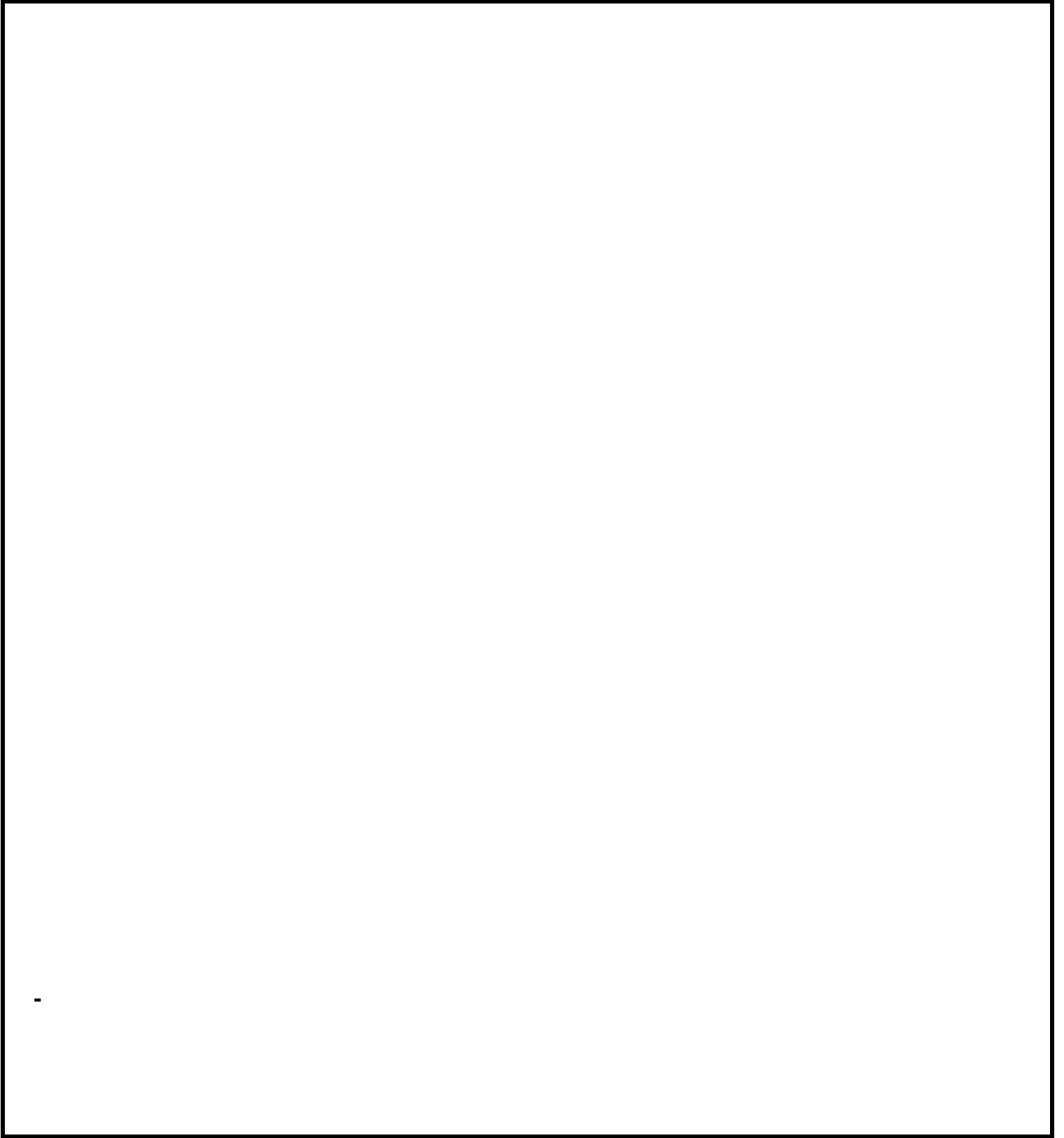
There are also 4 other dates that could be made available to us if a reason pops up that we might want to use the facilities. They will be offered to us first.
