Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The President, Karl opened the meeting at 7:45. There were 12 members present with no guests.

The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as presented by the Secretary Doug Geisel. CARRIED.

New Business

The Zone Fun Fly current events were discussed. Some of the volunteers would be the Shriners Club. They will be looking for people to sign up on sponsor sheets to raise money for the St. Jude Hospital on that day. Cost for the Fun Fly weekend will be \$12.00 per day or \$20.00 for the weekend. This

Fun Fly will be held in Smith Falls at the Montague Airport on July 25-26, 2009. Also there will be a Giant Scale Rally held in Kingston on Fathers day June 22-23, 2009.

The Club now has a used 16 Horsepower 42" cut Craftsman Lawn Tractor from parts taken from the old Columbia Tractor as converted by Ed Renaud. Karl advised us that the Toro Lawn Mower runs but throws oil. Karl will disassemble and check it out. A motion was made by Andre Levallée for Karl to go ahead and repair the mower if only an oil gasket is needed to repair same. Seconded by Ed. Renaud. CARRIED.

Since J.C. Seguin was kind enough to drive to Iroquois to pick up the Toro mower a motion was made by Ed. Renaud to give J.C.Seguin a \$15.00 Canadian Tire gift certificate. Seconded by Jeb Ward. CARRIED.

It was noted that Andre Levallee used his own mower to cut the field that week and the grass cutting procedure was outlined. The grass cutting schedule is up on the notice board for everyone to fill in the times that they are available to mow the grass. Gate is not to be left open. It is preferable that two people work together when cutting the grass. Karl would like a ridge of grass along the roadway left uncut, to keep the cars from encroaching on the grassy area.

On June 20th at 8:00 a.m. a "Work Day" is scheduled to do various odd jobs at the field such as:

- The culvert leading to the toilet has to be lowered back down in the ground so that the mower can be driven into the bushy area.
- The skirting around the base of the Club House has to be painted with the left over stain from the picnic tables.
- Some trees are to cut and the rotten stump at the entrance is to be cut up for disposal.
- The ceiling in the Club House is to be finished with drywall.
- Purchase a new battery for the clock in the Club House.
- The garbage is to be emptied from inside and outside of the Club House.

Karl requested that the Club purchase six 2' x 2' patio stones for float fly pilot stations Moved by Roger Bélanger and

Seconded by Andre Levallee. CARRIED.

Paint is required for the signs and the Buoys.

Ed. Renaud will bring the tents to the Club House soon.

A windsock and a pole is required for the Float Fly.

Set up will be at 5:00 p.m. on Friday evening at Guidon Park. Flying is to commence on Saturday morning at 9:00 a.m. Roger mentioned that Dave Reid will perform an IMAC Demo flight @12:00 during the Club Fun Fly.

A cordless microphone is needed for announcing at the Fun Flies.

A complaint was made that on a recent Saturday morning one of our members showed up to fly but found that there were no members flying as an event was taking place out of town and most of our members were attending. He asked if these events could be included in the newsletter in future.
